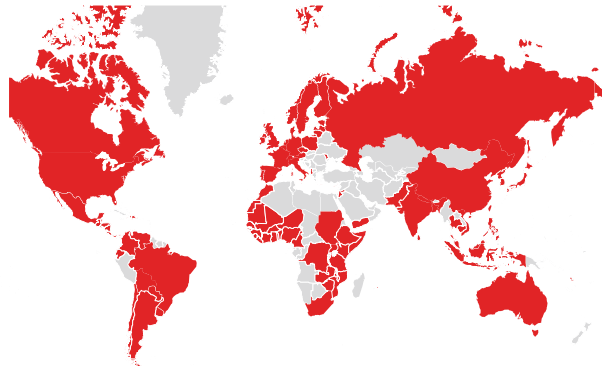

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Who we are

Beyond2015 is a global civil society campaign, bringing together over 1000 organisations from over 130 countries.

Whilst participating organisations have a range of views regarding the content of a post-2015 framework, we are united in working together to achieve the following:

- ▶ A global, overarching, cross-thematic framework to succeed the Millennium Development Goals, reflecting **Beyond2015's** policy positions.

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What we do

National and Regional Hubs

Beyond2015, the International Forum of National NGO Platforms (IFP) and Climate Action Network (CAN International) work together through regional hubs in Africa, Asia, Pacific, Latin America and Europe, and through national hubs in almost 40 countries.

Input into the post-2015 discussions

Beyond2015 representatives have presented the campaign's key messages at high level events nationally, regionally and globally, including the 'Setting the Stage' events of the President of the General Assembly and the Open Working Group meetings in New York.



The VPVC process (Vision, Purpose, Values, Criteria)

Beyond2015 develops civil society input to the 'content' of the post-2015 framework through an open, participatory process involving civil society organisations around the world.



Participate initiative

The Participate initiative was convened with the Institute of Development Studies, along with the **Beyond2015** Campaign, to undertake participatory research with those most affected by poverty and injustice and feed results into the political process.
