INTRODUCING FoRS

FoRS - Czech Forum for Development Cooperation - is a platform of Czech non-governmental non-profit organisations (NGOs) and other non-profit subjects, involved in development cooperation, development education and humanitarian assistance.

FoRS was founded by 15 NGOs in September 2002 and legally registered as an association of legal entities in October 2002. By the end of 2008, FoRS already represented 29 member organisations and 16 observers - among those are NGOs, foundations, international organisations, universities and others.

FoRS organisations share the common interest of pursuing more relevance and effectiveness of both Czech and international development cooperation and enhancing its positive impact on people living in developing and transforming countries. The main task of FoRS is to represent the common interest of its members and to strengthen the relations and cooperation between the state administration in the Czech Republic, the European Union, and non-governmental organisations in the field of development cooperation.

In 2003, FoRS was one of the founding members of CONCORD, the European NGO Confederation for Relief and Development (www. concordeurope.org). CONCORD is an umbrella association of national platforms and networks of NGOs from the EU Member States that represent all together over 1600 NGOs. CONCORD regularly engages in dialogue with the European institutions, and FoRS can defend the interests of Czech NGOs at the European level by means of active participation in CONCORD.

Vision: the long-term aims of FoRS

 Extreme poverty elimination, environmentally sustainable and socially just development, defending and protecting human rights, and non-violent conflict resolution

Mission: why FoRS exists

 Jointly enhance effectiveness, quality and volume of the Czech official development and humanitarian assistance, strengthen the positive impacts of Czech development and humanitarian organisations and institutions in partner countries as well as in the Czech Republic, and at the related policies making (in accordance with the vision of FoRS)

Values: the key principles FoRS wants to pursue

 Cooperation and inclusion, participation and transparency, sustainability and accountability, respect to diversity, justice and solidarity

Activities: what FoRS does

- Information and education: organising educational actions, seminars, international conferences; ensuring participation of the representatives and members of FoRS in similar international events abroad; publishing materials related to development issues
- Coordination and dialogue: supporting joint cooperation among members; definition of jointly agreed standards and how to meet them; coordination of common development activities targeting policy makers and officials, non-governmental sector, public and other target groups
- Representation and advocacy of members' common interests: development of partnership with key institutional partners at the national and international levels; active monitoring and influencing of the legislative and financial framework of the development and humanitarian NGOs; general pressure on the Czech state administration to support the civil society in order to establish dialogue and foster participation in decision-making

Sources of Funding

The operation of FoRS is mainly funded by grants provided by the Czech Ministry of Foreign Affairs, by FoRS membership contributions, by the European programme "Presidency Fund", and in the past also by the programme of the Austrian government "Regional Partnership Programme for Austria and New Member States" (RPP) and the Canadian programme CIDA-ODACE. Further assistance is provided by the European NGO confederation CONCORD and the TRIALOG project.

FoRS Membership

Membership in FoRS is open to all independent NGOs and academic institutions from the Czech Republic working in development and relief. Organisations can access FoRS firstly as observers and later become full members. Membership rules and criteria are published in legally registered statutes at the website of FoRS (www.fors.cz).

Czech Forum for Development Co-operation

FoRS Structure

FoRS is governed by all its members represented by the General Assembly. The Executive Board and the Advisory Board are elected by the General Assembly. The Executive Board's Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson(s) are elected by the Board itself. The Chairperson of the Executive Board is the statutory body of FoRS. The daily agenda and the organisational and financial management are carried out by the Secretariat lead by the Director who is accountable to the FoRS Executive Board.

FoRS member organisations and observers come together into working groups according to the thematic and geographic focus of their activities. FoRS working groups are the key way for FoRS organisations to engage in the common activities of the platform. The working groups can participate in the formulation of positions and the overall direction of FoRS.

Educational programme "Change the Game"

The "Change the Game" project is a three-year educational programme financed by the European Commission and directed at Czech elementary and secondary schools and youth clubs. With the help of interactive games, the programme brings participants into the atmosphere of Brazilian slums in the city of Fortaleza and thus gets the participants more acquainted with the very different and at the same time very similar life of their peers in this country. Games take a central place in the programme – the children have a chance to see pictures from slums and to learn how to play typical slum games or how to make toys out of waste (e.g. a soccer ball out of newspapers and plastic bags).

The example of Brazilian slums is used to refer to the global poverty problem and its impact on the life of children, who are the same all over the world – they like playing and enjoying life. Thanks to the programme, Czech children can find out that playing can be fun without having to buy expensive toys, and are encouraged to think of the abundance they are living in themselves.


